Their pay will be increased due to new certification. Volunteer FF Andrew Meckle has submitted his resignation. Motion Shewmaker, 2nd Brown to accept Meckle's resignation with regrets. MC; Recruit FF Timothy Miller has submitted his resignation. Motion Shewmaker, 2nd Brown to accept Miller's resignation with regrets. MC; Congratulated Col. Storrie and the ISO committee for achieving an ISO rating of 2/2Y; No Scholarships applications were submitted, will extend the deadline; Motion Brown, 2nd Shewmaker to surplus the 2010 Ford Expeditions (minimum bid must be \$2500)MC;

reported on the addition of Chapter 75A to the KRS which pertains to merged districts; Highlighted changes to HB 155 (aka baby box bill) which has passed and is now a law; recommends filing for the licensing to keep our 2nd CON. Motion Bauer, 2nd Pierce to move forward with licensing through the 2nd CON. MC; Motion Bannon, 2nd Brown to move forward with the bid from D2 Builders for the station # 1 restroom remodeling. *Disclaimer D2 Builders is owned by Lt. Col. <u>Deputy Chief Storrie:</u> Reported on ISO findings and report and current activity in the fireman's fund; Presented apparatus committees' process of determining the winning bids. *Disclaimer noted by Chairman Ott regarding his connection with the Seagrave representative and a previous work history with Pierce.* Committee recommends purchasing the Pierce apparatus. Discussion and questions from the Board followed. Motion Bannon, 2nd Brown to move forward with the purchase of the Pierce apparatus at a cost of \$1,046,729 with a prepayment discount of \$41,910.00. Discussion on motion. Bannon and Brown amended the motion to approve the purchase of the Pierce apparatus at a cost of \$1,046,729 and financing will be contingent on the best financing option available to the District as approved by the Chief and Treasurer Pierce. Chairman Ott acknowledged and thanked the members of the ISO committee and the Apparatus committee for their diligent work.

<u>Deputy Chief Evans:</u> Reported on recent trainings; training academy property was recently assessed, and assessment will be discussed at upcoming meeting; ESO fire module is being used and is progressing; reported on apparatus issues.

<u>Lt. Col. Hutchens</u>: App is under development and should be up and running in 4 – 6 weeks; working with Chamber for upcoming events; operation Brightside cleanup will be held this coming weekend; Sgt Hill is looking for assistance with the website.

Major Neal: EMS new hires started last week and will start on shift work 4/18; 7183 & 7185 will be inspected 4/14; discussed training; part time EMT Zac Moore has obtained his paramedic certification and asked Board to upgrade him to a PRN Paramedic. Motion Brown, 2nd Shewmaker to approve Z. Moore as a PRN Paramedic. MC Major Schmidt: no report had to leave for fire run

Major Elstone: Panera has started inside work on their new building.
